## TOTAL INVESTMENT



9k originations totaling \$1.2 billion

## BUSINESS INVESTMENT



Of that activity, 2.5k loans and investments totaling \$296.7 million went to New Mexico businesses, nonprofits, and community facilities, with the balance going to individuals and families.

## REAL ESTATE



154.2k sq. ft. of commercial real estate constructed or rehabilitated

## CONSUMER LOANS



419 consumer loans totaling \$600.7k

## HOUSING



873 home purchase and improvement loans totaling \$825.9 million, including \$179.5 million to 1.5k first-time homeowners



257 affordable housing units financed

## OTHER FACTS AND FIGURES (AS OF FEBRUARY 2025)

- There are 17 certified CDFIs headquartered in New Mexico, including 8 credit unions, 9 loan funds.
- There are 96 CDFI branches in New Mexico.
- There are also 3 Native CDFIs in New Mexico.
- The CDFI Fund has awarded a total of \$134 million in financial assistance to New Mexico-headquartered CDFIs along with \$346 million in NMTC allocation and CDFI Bond awards to CDFIs and CDEs headquartered in New Mexico.
